Taking the title at face value, I read this book for the first time at age 11. I actually checked it out from my elementary school library! I have since read it six more times, understanding it better each time. The first edition was published in 1916, the 5th edition (my copy of it) in 1952. It was written in German and then translated to somewhat formal English. It does contain an equation here and there, and only the most basic black-and-white line drawings for occasional illustrations. In other words, it is a true classic that will make you think. The principles taught in this book are truly bedrock essentials for understanding how the universe works. I have literally kept this book by my bedside for years. Highly recommended for you and your children.
